

Hein Koh was born in 1976 in Jersey City, NJ to Korean immigrant parents, and was raised in northern New Jersey. She graduated from Dartmouth College in 1998, receiving a B.A. in Studio Art and a B.A. in Psychology, as well as the Wolfenden Fine Arts Prize. From 2002-2004 she attended Yale University School of Art, where she received her M.F.A. in Painting/Printmaking and the Carol Schlosberg Memorial Prize for painting. In 2006, she was awarded an Artist and Communities grant from the Mid-Atlantic Arts Foundation, which funded an interdisciplinary arts project sponsored by COSACOSA Art at Large, a non-profit arts organization based in Philadelphia. Her work has been shown in New York, Philadelphia, and San Francisco, receiving press in The New York Times and The Philadelphia Inquirer. She currently lives and works in New York City, where she is on the faculty of the Art Center at the 92<sup>nd</sup> Street Y and The Creative Center, a non-profit organization dedicated to teaching the arts to people living with cancer.
